2 Timothy 1:1-5; 3:14-17

Paul reminds us of how vitally important it is to hand God's Word down from generation to generation.

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, according to the promise of life that is in Christ Jesus, ²To Timothy, my dear son: Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord. ³I thank God, whom I serve, as my forefathers did, with a clear conscience, as night and day I constantly remember you in my prayers. ⁴Recalling your tears, I long to see you, so that I may be filled with joy. ⁵I have been reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and, I am persuaded, now lives in you also. . . . But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, ¹⁵and how from infancy you have known the holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, ¹⁷so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

GOSPEL

Matthew 18:1-14

Jesus stresses how precious children are.

At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, “Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?”²He called a little child and had him stand among them. ³And he said: “I tell you the truth, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. ⁴Therefore, whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. ⁵And whoever welcomes a little child like this in my name welcomes me. ⁶But if anyone causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to have a large millstone hung around his neck and to be drowned in the depths of the sea. ⁷Woe to the world because of the things that cause people to sin! Such things must come, but woe to the man through whom they come! ⁸If your hand or your foot causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. It is better for you to enter life maimed or crippled than to have two hands or two feet and be thrown into eternal fire. ⁹And if your eye causes you to sin, gouge it out and throw it away. It is better for you to enter life with one eye than to have two eyes and be thrown into the fire of hell. ¹⁰See that you do not look down on one of these little ones. For I tell you that their angels in heaven always see the face of my Father in heaven. ¹²What do you think? If a man owns a hundred sheep, and one of them wanders away, will he not leave the ninety-nine on the hills and go to look for the one that wandered off? ¹³And if he finds it, I tell you the truth, he is happier about that one sheep than about the ninety-nine that did not wander off. ¹⁴In the same way your Father in heaven is not willing that any of these little ones should be lost.”

Emil Schuh Biography

Emil Schuh was born in Mobridge, South Dakota, on December 21, 1956. His parents, Benjamin and Doris, settled down on a ranch near the small town of Isabel where he attended grade school. Emil attended high school at Northwestern Lutheran Academy in Mobridge and graduated in 1975. After high school he helped his father on the ranch and then found employment in the oil fields near Gillette, Wyoming.

He then attended college at Dr. Martin Luther College in New Ulm, Minnesota, and graduated in 1980 with a bachelor's degree in Elementary Education. He has taken post graduate classes from UW Whitewater, South Dakota State University, Martin Luther College, and UW Green Bay.

Emil has three brothers and two sisters who all live west of the Mississippi River. The Lord has blessed Emil with a wonderful wife, Deb, whom he married in 1993.
