**6<sup>th</sup> Grade Immunizations:** The Wisconsin Student Immunization Law requires that all students entering 6<sup>th</sup> grade receive a dose of Tdap (Tetanus/diphtheria/pertussis) vaccine. Please have your child immunized well in advance of school starting, as it is often difficult to get clinic appointments if you wait until late summer. Call your provider, or the Fond du Lac County Health Department (929-3085) to check your child's immunization records.

### Preschool Happenings by Mrs. Westphal

#### *Devotions Based on Bible Verses*

Each day this week a devotion was read based on a different Bible verse:

Day 1 - Genesis 1:1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

Day 2 - John 3:16 For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.

Day 3 - Proverbs 3:5 Trust in the lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding.

We learned the song "Who Made the Sky So Bright and Blue?" and a song using the words of Proverbs 3:5 & 6.

#### *Farm and Baby Animals*

Our theme was farm and baby animals so we found a variety of ways to incorporate them into our day.

During gym/outside time:

1. We moved to music with various animal movements.

2. A game similar to "Duck, Duck, Goose" was played Farmer, Farmer, (The name of a farm animal.)

3. We took an outdoor hike searching for signs of life in and around a tree.

In song during quiet reading time and when waiting to get our coats we heard "Little Yellow Duck", "Old MacDonald", and "Mary Had A Little Lamb."

In art:

\*We made our own binoculars with toilet paper rolls, rubber bands and paint to take on our hike.

\*Glue was swirled on black construction paper. String was laid on the glue for a 3D effect. The end product was a spider web.

With books:

\*We have many books in the animal section that we use for quiet reading.

\*Bedtime Blessing shows the adult and baby animals getting ready to go to sleep.

\*Going to Sleep on the Farm shows a child and animals on a farm going to sleep.

\*Lucky Ducklings is about rescuing baby ducklings from a fall in the catch basin.

\*Tails shows the variety of long, short, colorful, furry, etc. tails that God gave to animals.

\*Farmyard Pop-Up Faces lets children put their heads into each page of the book so their friends can see each farm animal come to life.

In centers we can explore: animal/dot dominoes, Garanimals 1-10, wooden animal and "Whose baby?" table puzzles, and a wild animal floor puzzle. There is Noah's Ark, a wooden farm, animal lotto, and Spanish/English matching animal cards.

#### *Unit 9 of Happily Ever After*

1. We listened to the Big Book Peter and the Wolf building vocabulary and background.

2. Concept Development of triangle, pencil, white, and more was done. "Triangle Hunt" was played.

3. Problems and solutions were identified in the Peter and the Wolf storybook.

#### *3K Shapes*

Little Kids Trace helped us practice squares and triangles.

#### *Math*

Pattern task cards were used with pattern blocks to match and continue given patterns.
