Last Day of School Hot Lunch: We will be ordering Domino's for the last day of school. A slip is going home with every child to mark if they will be taking hot lunch that day. Please return this to you child's teacher by Tuesday, May 25.

Hot Lunch Accounts: As you plan payments for the remainder of the school year, note that there are 5 school days left, and that means 5 hot lunches, at \$2.85 each, or \$14.25 for all 5 days. Negative balances need to be taken care of by the last day of school. Positive balances can be carried over into the next school year. If you would like a refund of any positive balance, please let Mrs. Zuberbier know (pamzuberbier@stpetersfdl.net). She will be at school on the last day. Any families that don't have a returning student can get a refund, if requested, or else any remaining balance will be put into the Student Aid Fund.

8th Grade Dinner: Our 8th graders will be having their end of the year dinner here at school in the commons on Monday, May 24 at 6:00pm.

Lost & Found: Please have your child check this over before summer break. Anything left will make its way to the WLA thrift store over summer.

Graduation Service: Our graduation service is Thursday, May 27 at 6:30pm. Report cards will be handed out in school on the 27th. Any unclaimed

report cards after that day will be placed at the front desk for pick-up.

Extended Care Accounts & Electronic Key Cards: As the school year comes to an end, our last day of After School Care will be next Wednesday, May 26. Please take care of any remaining balance as soon as possible. We will not be collecting payments after the graduation service this year (as we had in the past). Any payments made after school is out may be dropped off in the office. Any remaining credits will carry-over until next year.

If you are not returning next year or if you do not need your key card, you may return it to get your deposit back. Otherwise, you have the option to hang on to the card and we will hold onto your deposit.

Summer Worship Schedule: May 30 is the start of our summer worship schedule (Memorial – Labor Day weekends). Early service will still be held at 7:45am, but late service will begin at 10:00am. Thursday worship remains at 6:30.
