Jupiter Grades: Please keep in mind that we are using the online grading system Jupiter grades this year for grades 1-8.  New families will receive a password to access your child's grades. The passwords from last year will still work for returning families. If you have forgotten yours, please see Mrs. Hinds and she will reset a new one for you.

School Calendar: Keep in mind that you can access our calendar on the website under the St. Peter's School heading at www.stpetersfdl.net. School & church related activities. are always placed on this calendar so that you can stay up to date.

Electronic Key Cards: Families with children in after school care will be given a key card to access the electronic lock on our door. The doors will normally lock at 3:15pm, so any extended care families will need this card to access the building after that time.

We are requesting a \$10 deposit for key cards, as the replacement value on them is expensive. The \$10 will be returned at the end of the school year when the key is turned back in. The keys should be activated for those returning families who kept their key cards from last year.

Locked Doors: Both sets of doors will be locked during the school day. If you are picking up your child for an appointment, they will be waiting in the office for you or we will call down to the teacher to let them know you are here. If you are dropping something off for your child, bring it to the office and Anna or Ashley will take it down to your child's locker or classroom.

Scrip: We will have Scrip available for purchase in the school office on Thursday and Friday mornings and after each church service.

For those new parents who might be unfamiliar with Scrip, this program allows you to buy gift cards for your everyday purchases such as groceries and gas. The companies that deal in Scrip then give a percentage back to you as a tuition credit when you buy these cards. For example – you can buy a \$100 gas card for Kwik Trip. Kwik Trip will give 5% back (\$5.00) that will be divided into a percentage for your tuition (40%) and for WLA (60%) as managers of the program. The percentages back from the cards can be anywhere from 2% to 15% based on the company. It adds up to a nice tuition discount for you and a gift to WLA for spending money that you would have used to make your everyday purchases.

Produce for Lunch: The SPLS Lunch Program is accepting donations of fresh produce. If your garden is producing over-abundantly, please talk to Bekah Herbrand or email her at bekahherbrand@stpetersfdl.net if you'd like to donate something. We will take almost any whole, fresh produce, fruit or vegetable! If you get a good deal on paper towels, or snacks such as animal crackers, we would take donations of those as well!

We keep this as a closed page, so you will need to request access from the administrator to use it. If you'd like to join, just send a request.
