SERVICE THEME

Hail the King who humbly comes to save us!

- + Today's service begins with the account of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem and then moves to the monumental story of his suffering and death. The juxtaposition of these two readings emphasizes that Palm Sunday led directly to Good Friday. Both days were part of our Savior's saving work. While their tone could not have been more different, their purpose was the same: the salvation of all people.
- + Our "sermon" today will be the receiving of the Lord's Supper, given and shed for you, and the hearing of the Passion History. There is two-fold wisdom in taking in the whole history of our Lord's Passion: (1) there are many who did not attend all of the midweek Lenten services and will now be able to hear the story of our Lord's suffering and (2) even those who have heard the Passion History before will benefit from hearing the whole story in one sitting. Simply put, more Jesus for more souls more often is always a good thing.
- + *The service begins with the pastor by the sanctuary doors.*

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you. And also with you.

Dear friends in Christ, for five weeks of Lent we have been preparing for the celebration of our Lord's paschal mystery. Today we come together to begin the solemn celebration of Holy Week. Christ entered in triumph into his own city to complete his work as our Messiah: to suffer, to die, and to rise again. Let us remember with devotion his entry that culminated at the empty tomb and follow him with a lively faith. United with him by Baptism, we share in his resurrection and new life. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest!

Let us pray. God our Father, we remember how Jesus entered Jerusalem and was welcomed as a king by those who shouted "Hosanna!" and spread their clothing and palm branches in his path. Accept our praise, and listen to our prayers as we rejoice in our triumphant King, Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord.

SCRIPTURE

The Triumphant Entry into Jerusalem | Matthew 21:1-17

¹As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage on the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, ²telling them, "Go to the village ahead of you. Immediately you will find a donkey tied there along with her colt. Untie them and bring them to me. ³If anyone says anything to you, you are to say, 'The Lord needs them,' and he will send them at once." ⁴This took place to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet:

⁵Tell the daughter of Zion: Look, your King comes to you, humble, and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

⁶The disciples went and did just as Jesus commanded them. ⁷They brought the donkey and the colt, laid their outer clothing on them, and he sat on it. ⁸A very large crowd spread their outer clothing on the road. Others were cutting branches from the trees and spreading them out on the road. ⁹The crowds who went in front of him and those who followed kept shouting,

Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!

¹⁰When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred up, asking, "Who is this?" ¹¹And the crowds were saying, "This is Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee."

¹²Jesus entered the temple courts and drove out all those who were selling and buying in the temple. He overturned the tables of the money changers and the seats of those who were selling doves. ¹³ He said to them, "It is written, 'My house will be called a house of prayer,' but you are making it a den of robbers!" ¹⁴The blind and the lame came to him in the temple, and he healed them. ¹⁵But when the chief priests and the experts in the law saw the wonders he performed and heard the children calling out in the temple, "Hosanna to the Son of David!" they were indignant. ¹⁶They said to him, "Do you hear what they are saying?"

"Yes," Jesus told them, "Have you never read,

From the lips of little children and nursing babies you have prepared praise?"

¹⁷He left them, went out of the city to Bethany, and spent the night there.
