You who dwell in the dust, wake up and shout for joy. Alleluia!


Your dew is like the dew of the morning;



# As for me, I know that my Redeemer lives, and that at the end of time he will stand over the dust.



# SECOND LESSON (sermon text)

# 1 Corinthians 15:19-26

The first Adam brought death to the world; the second Adam brings life to God's people.

If our hope in Christ applies only to this life, we are the most pitiful people of all. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came by a man, the resurrection of the dead also is going to come by a man. For as in Adam they all die, so also in Christ they all will be made alive. But each in his own order:

# Christ as the firstfruits and then Christ's people, at his coming.

Then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has done away with every other ruler and every other authority and power. For he must reign "until he has put all his enemies under his feet." Death is the last enemy to be done away with.




Women: 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee.

#### **OUR CONFESSION OF FAITH**
