PRAYER OF THE DAY

Eternal God, your Son, Jesus Christ, is our true Sabbath rest. Help us to keep each day holy by receiving his Word of comfort that we may find our rest in him, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**

FIRST LESSON Deuteronomy 5:12-15

The Lord commanded that the Sabbath day be observed so that we might rest and remember all that he has done for us.

Observe the Sabbath day by setting it apart as holy, just as the LORD your God commanded you. ¹³Six days you are to serve and perform all of your regular work, ¹⁴but the seventh day is a sabbath rest to the LORD your God. You are not to do any regular work, you or your son or your daughter or your male servant or your female servant or your ox or your donkey or any of your livestock or the alien who resides inside your gates, in order that your male servant and your female servant may rest like you.

¹⁵Remember that you were slaves in the land of Egypt and that the LORD your God brought you out from there with a strong hand and an outstretched arm. Therefore the LORD your God commanded you to keep the day of rest.

The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

SECOND LESSON

Colossians 2:13-17

All God's commands about religious festivals and the Sabbath day were meant to point us to the spiritual rest found in Christ.

Even when you were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive with Christ by forgiving us all our trespasses. ¹⁴God erased the record of our debt brought against us by his legal demands. This record stood against us, but he took it away by nailing it to the cross. ¹⁵After disarming the rulers and authorities, he made a public display of them by triumphing over them in Christ.

GOSPEL Mark 2:23-3:6

Jesus promised he would not leave us alone but would send us the Spirit of truth to give us the courage and power to testify to the world.

Once on a Sabbath day, Jesus was passing through the grain fields, and his disciples began to pick heads of grain as they walked along. ²⁴The Pharisees said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the Sabbath day?"

²⁵He replied to them, "Have you never read what David did when he was in need and hungry (he and his companions)? ²⁶He entered the house of God in the time of Abiathar the high priest and ate the Bread of the Presence, which is not lawful for anyone to eat, except for the priests. He also gave some to his companions."

²⁷Then Jesus said to them, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. ²⁸So the Son of Man is the Lord even of the Sabbath." ^{3:1}Jesus entered the synagogue again, and a man was there with a withered hand. ²They were watching

Jesus closely to see if he would heal the man on the Sabbath day, so that they could accuse him.

³He said to the man with the withered hand, "Step forward!" ⁴Then he said to them, "Is it lawful on the Sabbath day to do good or to do evil, to save life or to kill?" But they were silent.

⁵Then he looked around at them with anger, deeply grieved at the hardness of their hearts. He said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." The man stretched it out, and his hand was restored.

⁶The Pharisees left and immediately began to conspire against Jesus with the Herodians, plotting how they might kill him.
