The Faith of our Fathers

In 1839 one group of over 800 immigrants, Lutherans from Germany, landed in the US. These folks were headed to Buffalo NY, and Milwaukee, Cedarburg, Freistadt and Mequon Wisconsin. The opportunities found here were relayed back to friends and family in Germany. At the same time, life for confessional Lutherans was becoming more difficult in Germany. Out of concern for their faith, and for their future "companies" of like-minded Lutherans were formed to begin a new life under freedom. Some of these groups numbered in the hundreds. They consisted of participants from all walks of life. Some financial assistance came from family members already here. They pooled their resources, the wealthy giving up 20% of their worth to enable those of lesser blessings to also move to a whole new world. Between 1848 and 1858 over one million migrated to the states from Germany. By 1897 the total was more than four million. The faithful Lutherans who settled in the Milwaukee area founded the Synod of Wisconsin in 1850. And, our Synod started its life with a severe shortage of pastors.

These immigrants were faced with a challenging journey. Most came from Bremen to New York on wooden sailing vessels with no guarantee that they would survive the trip. The number of passengers was calculated at 2 square feet per person. They would be at sea for at least 40 days and perhaps as many as 80. Food and potable water were scarce. Storms and fires and shipwreck were a constant threat as were sickness and starvation.

Our sister congregation in Jenera, Ohio, celebrates "Ship Wreck Sunday" each year. The founding fathers and their families narrowly escaped death when their ship was battered on a rocky coast along the eastern seaboard. Miraculously everyone made it to shore. Also check out the website of Germanology Unlocked, From Germany to America – An 1853 Journey. Here you will find the translated letter from 22 year old Wilhelm Riecker to his family back in Germany recounting his 57 day sea journey.

Oh, for a faith that will not shrink though pressed by many a foe, That will not tremble on the brink of poverty or woe.

That will not murmur nor complain beneath the chast'ning rod, But in the hour of grief or pain can lean upon its God.
