**PASTOR AND KRIS LINDEMANN** are at their niece's wedding this weekend. Alison Lindemann, of Spring Hill, Florida, is marrying Rev. Caleb Klatt of Abiding Peace Lutheran Church in Elgin, Illinois.

**PASTOR BOEHRINGER UPDATE** This week I've completed my third of six summer chemo treatments. I have three more rounds of chemotherapy scheduled for July 1-3, 15-17, and 29-31. On these Mondays Sarah and I go to Froedtert to get blood work, meet with our cancer team, and begin the chemo. They send me home with a chemo pump which I carry around in a bag. On Wednesdays I drive down to West Bend's Froedtert and get the pump disconnected. Once these rounds are done, I get a break during August to help build strength in anticipation of the big surgery. This is set for September 13 at Froedtert's main campus. The surgeon goes in and removes the tumors from my abdomen. The second part is that they swish around chemo in your belly, rinse you out, and sew you back up. That's the ideal outcome. I go into much more details about other possible outcomes to this surgery in the long version in your email, along with an update about the Boehringer family. Don't worry; this update is good news--all glory to our dear Father, who art in heaven!

The Faith of our Fathers

In the summer of 1857, Pastor Gottlieb Fachtmann was among the multitude of immigrants to the United States. He aligned himself with the Synod of Wisconsin and was appointed as the first traveling missionary. He was a bachelor and a pastor of great zeal. There were no trains, roads were primitive. Traveling was on foot and horseback or by canoe and stagecoach through all sorts of weather. Everywhere he went he managed to find a group of Lutherans. He is cited as the founding pastor by many congregations in Wisconsin and Minnesota.

Pastor Fachtmann came to Fond du Lac in August of 1858 and was well received. On Monday, August 2, 100 people gathered to hear him preach. The men in attendance agreed to meet again Sunday evening August 8. 23 men attended. They decided to organize as a congregation and set another meeting for the following Sunday, August 15. During the week articles of organization were written, and Sunday, August 15, at 5:00 in the afternoon at the Presbyterian Church at Main and First, 47 men signed the constitution and St. Peter's was born.

On October 18<sup>th</sup> the new congregation extended a call to Pastor Fachtmann, which he accepted. He immediately urged the congregation to also align with the Synod of Wisconsin. St. Peter's became the 21<sup>st</sup> congregation to do so. Pastor Fachtmann served only until July of the following year.
