### FIRST LESSON

Lamentations 3:22-33

*God's people were suffering. But the prophet Jeremiah knew that suffering and impending death can focus our attention on what matters—the LORD's compassion and salvation.*

By the mercies of the LORD we are not consumed, for his compassions do not fail. <sup>23</sup>They are new every morning. Great is your faithfulness. <sup>24</sup>My soul says, "The LORD is my portion. Therefore, I will hope in him." <sup>25</sup>The LORD is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him. <sup>26</sup>It is good to hope quietly for the salvation of the LORD. <sup>27</sup>It is good for a man that he bears a yoke early in his life. <sup>28</sup>Let him sit alone and be silent, because the LORD has laid this upon him. <sup>29</sup>Let him stick his face in the dust. Perhaps there still is hope. <sup>30</sup>Let him turn his cheek toward the one who strikes

him. Let him be filled with disgrace. <sup>31</sup>For the LORD will not push us away forever.

<sup>32</sup>Even though he brings grief, he will show compassion on the basis of his great mercy.

<sup>33</sup>Certainly, it is not what his heart desires when he causes affliction, when he brings grief to the children of men. + The Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

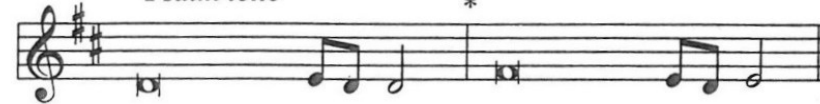

## SECOND LESSON

2 Corinthians 4:7-15

*Serving Christ might result in death. But Paul also knew that resurrection in Christ follows.*

We hold this treasure in clay jars to show that its extraordinary power is from God and not from us. <sup>8</sup>We are hard pressed on every side, yet not crushed; perplexed, yet not despairing; <sup>9</sup>persecuted, yet not forsaken; struck down, yet not destroyed. <sup>10</sup>We always carry around in our body the death of the Lord Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body. <sup>11</sup>To be sure, while we are living we are continually being handed over to death because of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our mortal flesh. <sup>12</sup>So then, death is working in us, but life is working in you. <sup>13</sup>Since we have that same spirit of faith, which corresponds to what is written: “I believed; therefore, I have spoken,” we also believe, and therefore we speak. <sup>14</sup>For we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will also raise us with Jesus and bring us (together with you) into his presence. <sup>15</sup>In fact, all this is for your benefit, so that as grace increases, it will overflow to the glory of God, as more and more people give thanks. + The Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

## GOSPEL (Sermon Text)

Mark 5:21-24a, 35-43

*Jesus raises the young daughter of a synagogue leader from the dead as easily as you would wake a sleeping twelve-year old from a nap.*

When Jesus had again crossed over in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around him near the sea. <sup>22</sup>Then one of the synagogue rulers, named Jairus, came. When he saw Jesus, he fell at his feet <sup>23</sup>and repeatedly pleaded with him, “My little daughter is near death. Please come and place your hands on her so that she may be healed and live.” <sup>24</sup>Jesus went with him. <sup>35</sup>While he was still speaking, people from the synagogue ruler’s house arrived, saying, “Your daughter is dead. Why bother the Teacher anymore?” <sup>36</sup>But when Jesus heard this report, he told the synagogue ruler, “Don’t be afraid. Only believe.” <sup>37</sup>He did not allow anyone to follow him except Peter, James, and John the brother of James. <sup>38</sup>They went into the house of the synagogue ruler, and Jesus saw a commotion with people weeping and wailing loudly. <sup>39</sup>When he entered, he said to them, “Why are you making a commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but sleeping.” <sup>40</sup>They laughed at him. But after he put everyone out, he took the father of the child, her mother, and those who were with him and went in where the child was. <sup>41</sup>Grasping the hand of the child, he said to her, “*Talitha, koum!*” (When translated, that means, “Little girl, I say to you, arise!”) <sup>42</sup>Immediately the little girl stood up and began to walk around. (She was twelve years old.) They were completely and utterly amazed. <sup>43</sup>Then he gave them strict orders not to let anyone know about this, and he told them to give her something to eat. + The Gospel of the Lord. **Praise be to you, O Christ!**
