A year-ago at this time we had a deficit of \$137,254.08 versus a 2024 deficit of \$142,150.64 as of the end of June. Both years had 26 Sundays as of the end of June. Our total accumulated deficit at the beginning of the year was \$10,364.24 which has increased to \$152,514.88 as of June 30th.

The Faith of our Fathers

In the 1860's, between the telegraph and the railroads, communications were steadily improving. The telegraph went transcontinental in 1861 (and transatlantic in 1866). Communications that formerly took days to months to receive could now happen in minutes. It was a vital tool for the North and the South and delivered news rapidly to an anxious country.

January 1, 1863, President Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation effectively freeing all slaves. He delivered his most renowned speech, The Gettysburg Address, on November 19 that same year. Through newspapers and the telegraph almost every American "heard" that speech.

And, life continued at St. Peter's. In July of 1864 Pastor Mayerhoff filled the vacancy created when Kern left. Mayerhoff was also a recent arrival from Germany. He had for his use a church building, and a brand-new building for teaching the evergrowing school, with an upper flat for his home. St. Peter's was prospering. The congregation realized that the pastor had to be relieved from teaching and decided to enlist a full-time qualified teacher.

1865 began with renowned confidence. On March 4, Lincoln was inaugurated for his second term. It appeared that the war was winding down. The congregation would soon be seven years old, and St. Peter's school year would begin under the leadership of Gustave Denninger. The Lenten season began with continued war reports. Then, finally, good news! On April 9, Palm Sunday, Lee surrendered to Grant at the Appomattox Court House in Virginia. The war was over! It had claimed more than 620,000 lives.

One can scarcely imagine what grateful hearts filled the nation and our growing family. Holy Week would have been filled with prayers of thanks and for the safe return of the weary, worn and maimed. Preparations could begin for a truly joyful Easter after these many years.

But it was not to be. On Good Friday evening, April 15, 1865, President Lincoln was shot. He was dead by morning and the nation and the congregation mourned.
