**On this rock I will build my Church** The Faith of our Fathers

In 1865 life continued. Andrew Johnson was sworn in as president. He wasn't supposed to still be here. The assassination plot against Lincoln included killing Johnson, too. The country followed the gripping news of the ensuing murder trial. And, the immigrants kept coming. Fond du Lac continued to grow, and St. Peter's continued to grow.

Synod opened its first worker training school in Watertown in September. What became Northwestern College began its life as Wisconsin University. At St. Peter's Mr. Denninger opened the new school year. Under his direction enrollment greatly increased and within one year the brand-new building had to be enlarged and the teaching staff increased. Miss Magnussen became a full-time teacher assisted parttime by Miss Jurgens. It was not uncommon to have 100 or more children in a single classroom. Nine or more students shared one long plank desk with a long plank bench. Two rows of these "desks" spanned the room with an aisle between so the "switch" bearing teacher could maintain discipline. Teaching and learning were accomplished!

In 1886 St. Peter's hosted the convention of The Synod of Wisconsin for the second time. Pastor Wilhelm Striessguth was synod president from '65 through '67 while serving as Pastor of St. John's, Milwaukee, a very large congregation. He was suffering from exhaustion.

Our growing congregation faced another vacancy as, in August of '67 Mayerhoff accepted a call to Ripon. Due to the extreme shortage of Pastors, synod granted professor Meumann from Watertown a one-year leave of absence to serve our members. During his year here the congregation continued to make tremendous strides and difficult decisions. Early in 1868 the property on Marr, between 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Streets was purchased. This would become St. Peter's home for the next 139 years.

In August, Meumann returned to Watertown. The congregation called the aforementioned Pastor Streissguth, who badly needed a change of scenery. He was installed in October. The shortage of pastors now reached "critical mass" for it was this year that synod severed ties to the German church. The very issue that ignited the migration of the "Old Lutherans", the forced establishment of a state church merging all Protestants into one body, now meant the pastors who might come were no longer in doctrinal agreement. Earlier this decade synod had resolved to start a seminary program, but the effort foundered.

1869 was a banner year. One can almost hear the hustle and bustle of the growing city, the sound of hammer hitting wood, horses and wagons making their way through bumpy streets. Construction of the church began in February. It was an impressive wood frame building. To cut costs, the steeple was omitted. The school building was uprooted from its place and moved to the new location. That would have been a sight to behold, a spectator event. Men, horses, ropes and pulleys accomplished the task. The church was dedicated in October while construction of the parsonage was underway. The upper flat of the school would now house the male teacher and his family.

Before the year was over, Mr. Denninger resigned as teacher to study to become a pastor and the congregation was dealing with a large debt. My, how history repeats itself!!
