The Faith of our Fathers

It's 1875, Ulysses Grant is still in the White House and the nation is in the grips of the first "Great Depression." The "Panic of 1873" affected every citizen and lasted until 1879. The 1929 crash usurped the title and the old era was renamed the "Long Depression." The West was rapidly being settled. In 1876 Colorado became the 38th state, and with the transcontinental railroad, folks could travel from Omaha, NE to the Pacific in "only" two weeks.

The country was undergoing growing pains. There was sharp contrast between the industrialized East and the Wild West. In the East, the National League of Baseball and the Women's Christian Temperance Union were founded; the first Kentucky Derby run. Out West, wagon trains were still traversing the Oregon Trail and the Red River Indian War was fought.

By 1876 the contrast was extreme. Out East, Alexander Graham Bell demonstrated the telephone and New York City's Central Park opened. Philadelphia, the birthplace of the Declaration of Independence, hosted America's first world's fair. The "Centennial Exposition" showcased the meteoric rise of industrial power. It was open for 6 months and drew 10 million visitors from across the globe. Out West, the Battle of the Little Big Horn (Custer's Last Stand) was forever written into the history books and Wild Bill Hickok was gunned down in a poker game in Deadwood, SD.

Back in Wisconsin, also in 1876, synod founded Northwestern Publishing House and opened the Wisconsin Synod Bookstore in Milwaukee. They produced and sold mainly German language literature for churches.

St. Peter's was undergoing staffing issues. Teacher Oberdorsten was "relieved of his position", replaced by Scheunemann who lasted one year. In 1875 Nimmer replaced Scheunemann and remained for 4 years. He resigned in 1879 and was replaced by Carl Brenner. Mr. Brenner served thru 1889 and was still living when the congregation celebrated its centennial 69 years later.

In 1875 due to failing health, Pastor Meumann tendered his resignation. He continued serving until April of 1876. That June, Pastor George Hoelzel was installed. Within months his health became precarious. To alleviate the situation,

St. Peter's called his brother, Philip, of Great Bend, KS to serve as his assistant. Philip immediately accepted, praying his brother would be restored to good health. That did not happen. December of 1877 George died. He would not be the only beloved pastor to be taken from this life just before Christmas. With heavy hearts the congregation laid him to rest in Estabrook Cemetery. Philip Hoelzel served St. Peter's for 22 years.

Among the many duties expected of the two teachers they also were responsible for all music at church and school. At some point, the congregation purchased a used reed organ. This organ was in very sad condition. Some of the keys didn't play well at all, and some had to be propped up with matchsticks to stop the whistling. It was nicknamed the "wailing chest." In 1878, in commemoration of its 20th anniversary, the congregations purchased its first pipe organ. The reed organ had cost \$11, the pipe organ, \$1,000. That would be \$30,000 today.

The year 1878 brings to mind an interesting phenomenon that seems ever present. Children born in 1858 when St. Peter's was founded are now 20 years old. Neither they nor those born since can fathom or understand the hardship their parents endured to come to America, establish a new life, and build a compassionate and thriving congregation. So it is that our children below 16 and possibly below 20 cannot comprehend what life was like at 2nd & Marr. Each generation, each new family, each new member begins their own thread of history to St. Peter's.

We are God's house of living stones, built for his own habitation. He through baptismal grace us owns, heirs of his wondrous salvation. Were we but two his name to tell, yet he would deign with us to dwell With all his grace and his favor.
