A year-ago at this time we had a deficit of \$87,784.74 versus a deficit of \$188,725.14 as of the end of August. This year had 34 Sundays as of the end of August versus 35 Sundays last year. Our total accumulated deficit at the beginning of the year was 10,364.24 which increased to 199,089.38 as of the end of August. Remember that last year we received the Employee Retention Credit for wages paid during COVID totaling almost \$60,800. This does impact the comparison of the data above. The Contributions are about 4.8% below those of last year.

Other Notes:

Tuition for the 2023-2024 School Year: From 8/1/2023 through 7/31/2024, \$200,883.36 tuition dollars were received. Of that amount 44,158.43 was set aside for book purchases etc. and 5,904.15 was set aside for Chromebook purchases. That left 150,820.78 tuition dollars in the tuition fund. Of that amount 138,000 had been transferred to St. Peter's General Fund on a monthly basis (11,500 per month). The remaining 12,820.78 was transferred to the General Fund in August. This is reflected in the Other Receipts total above.

The Faith of our Fathers

March 4, 1885, Grover Cleveland became the 22nd president. A national project 20 years in the making finally reached completion with an incredible outpouring of public support. October 27, 1886, the Statue of Liberty was dedicated. The number of states remained unchanged for ten years while the wild west was being tamed. Then, between November 2 and 11, 1889, North Dakota, South Dakota, Montana, and Washington were added. The flag now had 42 stars.



Although the Long Depression ended in 1879, Fond du Lac was still feeling the effects. Population had dropped to 12,000. Several factories had closed. The threshing machine company moved to Minneapolis

becoming part of Minneapolis Moline. Chicago Northwestern, the most significant rail line in eastern Wisconsin and largest employer in Fond du Lac, moved their rail yard to Chicago. In this era a new but dangerous seasonal industry sprang up – ice harvesting on Lake Winnebago. The ice was cut into blocks 2 feet by 4 feet and 24" thick. The initial demand was for refrigerating rail cars. Very shortly it was a household commodity. Fond du Lac and Eau Claire became major suppliers to the entire country of ice boxes, the first practical home refrigeration that would be used for decades. Ice warehouses were constructed. Blocks of ice insulated with sawdust could be stored for many months. The delivery system was a horse drawn wagon and driver. If the household needed ice that day someone would have to remember to prop the sign in the front window!

At St. Peter's, Pastor Philip Hoelzel was still faithfully serving. Holy Communion was observed 7 times a year. These were 1) 1st Sunday in Advent, 2) Sylvester Eve (New Year), 3) Ash Wednesday, 4) Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, 5) Sunday before



Pentecost, 6) 6th Sunday in Trinity, and 7) 15th Sunday in Trinity. Note that Maundy Thursday and Good Friday counted as one. The Holy Week services would be filled to overflowing and could not accommodate the whole congregation.

The 30th anniversary was celebrated by making improvements to church furnishings. Fall of 1888 new pews replaced the wooden chairs and benches. If only those pews could talk! Although they needed attention from time to time, they

witnessed joy and laughter, tears and sorrow for the next **106 years.** The following Spring, on Palm Sunday, a new altar and pulpit were dedicated. No matter the economic circumstances, St. Peter's congregation, in steadfast faith, moved on.

As the decade closed out, most middle-class homes had a cast iron cook stove and a treadle sewing machine. March 4, 1889 Benjamin Harrison replaced Cleveland in the White House, and the Oklahoma Land Rush captivated the nation. Fond du Lac had a change to the skyline with the completion of the Episcopal Cathedral Church of St. Paul, the Apostle. At St. Peter's, faithful teachers Brenner and Boecher both accepted calls elsewhere and were replaced by Mr. Kleinschmidt and Mr. Jeske. With dedicated determination Miss Anna Schmedtjen continued to stay the course.

Like a mighty army moves the church of God;
Brothers we are treading where the saints have trod.
We are not divided, all one body we, one in hope and doctrine, one in charity.

with the cross of Jesus going on before.
