The Faith of our Fathers

1895 – 1899, the world in a nutshell! In 1895 Alfred Nobel, holder of 355 patents and inventor of dynamite, established the Nobel Peace Prize, and for the first time in history the White House Christmas tree was lit with electric lights. In 1896 Utah became the 45th state and the first "modern" Olympic Games were held in Greece. March 4, 1897 William McKinley became the 25th president. Later that year the Alaska Klondike gold rush made the headlines.



In 1898 Cuba, a colony of Spain, was undergoing extreme political unrest. The battleship Maine was sent to Havana to safeguard the fortunes US businesses had invested in sugar and other resources. February 15, 1898, the Maine exploded taking 260 sailors to their grave. April 25th the nation

declared war against Spain on behalf of Cuba. This skirmish was made memorable by the flamboyant Teddy Roosevelt and his Rough Riders. In December, The Treaty of Paris was signed giving Cuba its independence. Check out the Spanish-American War online. It's a far-reaching little-known piece of American history.

The city of Fond du Lac made an investment in the future spending \$500 to purchase 140 acres of lake front property. In 1898 the Fond du Lac Symphonic Band was organized. By the end of this decade and century, industrial revival boosted the population of the city. New industries included Badger Sewing Company, producer of shirts and overalls, and Fond du Lac Table Company, supplier of high-quality products to all parts of the country.

At synod, the shortage of pastors was less urgent. In this time period, 31 Northwestern grads moved on to the seminary at 6th and Lloyd, Milwaukee. June 24th-30th, 1896, synod met at St. Peter's for the 4th time. This was a very large gathering following the merger of the various synods four years earlier. Once again members hosted those attending in their homes. Dr. Martin Luther College was founded in 1884 to train pastors for the Minnesota Synod. It has evolved into the teacher training school for the Synodical Conference. This convention voted to permit "girls" to enroll. The first woman graduated in 1898. A catalog from that

time referred to boarding students as "inmates." With the multitude of strict rules that are part of its history, many graduates would cheerfully endorse that term.

During 1896 the congregation acquired its third organ. The first one was used, the second a less expensive pipe organ. This one was a new very high-quality pipe organ built by Hinners and Albertsen of Pekin, IL. It cost \$1,600, \$65,000 in today's dollars.

In 1898, in an effort to continue to supply the school with quality books and equipment, Pastor Hoelzel formed a school organization. Its members pledged to support the school treasury with monthly donations.

Fall of 1899, after 22 years of faithful service the congregation granted Pastor Hoelzel a peaceful release to accept a call to Norfolk, NE. Just before Christmas, December 10, Pastor Gustav Bergemann was installed and the congregation was poised to begin a very exciting new century.

Father let us dedicate all this year to you, In whate'er our earthly state, in whate'er we do. Not from sorrow, pain or care freedom dare we claim; This alone shall be our prayer, Glorify your name.

Can a child presume or choose where or how to live? Can a father's love refuse all the best to give? More you give us every day than the best can claim; Help us trust you that we may Glorify your name.
