PASTOR BOEHRINGER UPDATE It's been over a week since my September 13 surgery. I was discharged on Monday, September 16, and have been recovering at home since then. My incision is healing steadily. Hopefully, over the next several weeks the Lord will continue to bless me with progress. That's one thing and it's welcome news.

The other thing is not so good; for the time being, we are back in a period of uncertainty. Since the surgery didn't go as hoped, I still have many tumors. At this time, we don't know what treatment options are still possible. The surgeon was able to remove my appendix and some other tissue for analysis. Lord willing, this analysis will provide our oncology team with information that can more specifically direct my treatment. We meet with the surgeon at the beginning of October, and the oncology team at the end of October. The new plan will take time to put together, both because I need to heal before any treatment starts, and also because the tissue analysis can take several weeks. When we have more details, we will let you know.

For today consider Paul's words to Timothy: "Instruct those who are rich in this present age not to be arrogant or to put their hope in the uncertainty of [health], but rather in God, who richly supplies us with all things for our enjoyment. Instruct them to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous and willing to share. In this way they are storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of that which is truly life." (1 Timothy 6:17-19)

Health is never promised to us from Christ, but life now and forever is. This is what we cling to, the holy saving cross of Jesus, which makes us truly alive and eternally rich. And it also makes us generous! Thank you so very much to all of you for your generous prayers, support, and gifts during this time. In your daily devotion I ask you to ask Jesus to reveal a clear path forward from this uncertainty, but even if He doesn't, we know with steadfast clarity that whether we live or die, we are the Lord's. (Romans 14:8).

The Faith of our Fathers

It's 1900! The new century ushers in a booming economy across the nation. March 3, 1901, President McKinley was inaugurated for his second term with war hero Teddy Roosevelt as his vice president. On September 9, while shaking hands among the crowd attending the Pan American Exposition in Buffalo, NY, assassin's bullets struck. He died on September 14 and Roosevelt became the 26th president.



In 1902 a gentleman from Fond du Lac changed the faces of the nation. King Camp Gillette invented the double edge safety razor and beards disappeared. In 1903 transportation would be forever transformed, when Ford Motor Company and Harley Davidson were formed and the

Wright brothers took flight in the first motorized aircraft at Kitty Hawk, NC. April 1, 1904, The Louisiana Purchase Exposition opened in St. Louis, Missouri. When it closed on December 1, 20 million people had visited. There are many great websites about this event and several of the buildings have become historic landmarks. The same year the nation acquired the Panama Canal Zone.

In 1900, the Fond du Lac population had recovered making it the second largest city in the state. The historic bandstand at Lakeside Park was erected. Wisconsin Power and Light began operating the electric trolley line and built the streetcar waiting station, which is still a landmark at Taylor Park. North Fond du Lac was

being developed by a land company. Two lots were donated for establishing a Lutheran Church. An additional lot was purchased by St. Peter's.

At St. Peter's, October 30, 1900 a new women's group, the Frauenverein was begun with 41 charter members. In March 1901, the congregation completed a chapel on the North Fond du Lac site. The Frauenverein donated paraments and carpet. This was the birth of St. Paul's Ev. Lutheran Church. That same month the voters decided to replace the parsonage, which had been deemed unsafe. By September, that was all finished at a cost of \$3,100 (\$111,000 in today's dollars).

At school, Teacher Meyer resigned due to ill health and was replaced by candidate Bernard Hagedorn. Slow steady growth made 3 classrooms insufficient and the school building was also no longer sanitary. On April 6, 1902, the congregation voted to erect its 3rd new school complete with plumbing and electricity. Under the direction of Pastor Bergemann, aggressive fundraising was begun and within a month \$6,200 (\$220,000) of the total cost of \$14,600 (\$522,000) had been raised. Construction began in Spring 1903 and dedication celebrated October 25th. The modern school has a ground floor with assembly hall seating for 500 and 4 large main floor classrooms. Furnishings were provided by a \$1,000 donation from Frauenverein and \$2,500 from the Young People. This building would see continuous use for the next half century.

In 1903, a 16 voice Men's Choir was formed. F. Zeigler directed and provided violin accompaniment. Services were also enhanced by an orchestra of 10 instrumentalists. In 1904, the local AAL group was formed with 77 members. That fall, the ever-faithful Miss Schmedtjen requested a leave of absence for health concerns.

St. Peter's church and school had become a place to belong. This was a congregation that got things done and did them well. Its members embraced the progressive nature of the nation and welcomed into the fold the many immigrants still coming. Maintaining what they owed, establishing another new congregation and furthering the cause of Christian education is a legacy to be cherished and for which we must be ever grateful.

Christ is our cornerstone, on him alone we build.
