The Faith of our Fathers

"The night the churches burned" This small portion is from the 1958 Centennial Book: "But the Golden Anniversary jubilee joy in a few short weeks turned to real sorrow when in the night of September 25 of 1908 a holocaust-like fire, fanned by a powerful wind, swept up South Marr Street and caused real loss and extensive damage."

The following account is from the 1938, 80th Anniversary booklet, presumably written by then Pastor Bergemann (1899-1947.)

"September 25, 1908 will be remembered in Fond du Lac for many years to come. It was the night of the great fire. In the short space of time from 11:00 to 3:30, 2 churches, a garage, and 2 dwellings were entirely consumed. Grant School was damaged to the extent of \$12,000 (\$400,000) and our newly decorated church, of which we were so proud, came in for its share of loss, amounting to \$17,000 (\$500,000).

Cinders fanned by a strong south wind, filled the skies. At about 11:15 a small blaze, of but a few inches, was detected halfway up the spire. With the city's entire fire force at work on the blazing buildings elsewhere and no ladders at once available, members who had hurriedly gathered, felt powerless with the flames at that height. But their hearts cried to Heaven for help. And God surely answers prayer. They set to work, bravely disregarding all danger and, with the assistance of some of the city's firemen, succeeded in saving the building proper, although the spire burnt down to the belfry and the interior was ruined.

The faithful tower clock struck 12 and 1 when the fire reached the mechanism and silenced the bells. Truly a night not to be forgotten! God had heard the prayers of His children and guided their efforts in saving their beloved church, graciously preventing serious injury to all and permitting only minor hurts to a few. The belfry was rebuilt and a new spire of less height constructed during this year. The decorations were also gone over and other damages to the building repaired, with insurance covering the costs. Dedication of the new tower and the renewed church took place in January, 1909."

At the time of the fire, the city owned just 2 fire engines, and Marr had but one hydrant. The account above casually refers to a garage burning. It's where the fire

started. The Crescent Garage and the Crescent Auto and Machine Company and \$20,000 worth of vehicles were destroyed including the car owned by Wis. Lt. Gov. Connors. St. Joseph's Catholic Church and the Congregational Church burned to the ground. St. Joseph's had just laid in a supply of coal for the winter. Those 30 tons smoldered for days. St. Peter's damage is listed as \$10,000, but congregational history says \$17,000.

St. Peter's tall, graceful spire would not return. Restoration replaced it with a much shorter steeple. Evidently the new stained-glass windows, although filled with soot, were left unscathed. This bit of history brings to mind an old saying: The "church" is what is left when the building burns down. The faith of our father's had been tested over the years, but this time it was a real trial by fire. We cannot begin to fathom the terror of that night. It was truly by the grace of God that no lives were lost.

For further information online look up a FDL Reporter article printed September 24, 2014. Also, local historian, Tracy Reinhardt has written a book, same title: "The Night the Churches Burned."
