

The Faith of our Fathers

And the immigrants kept coming. In the years from 1900-1915, 40 million people entered the country. This equaled the prior 40 years. Glacier became a National Park in 1910, and in 1912, New Mexico and Arizona became the 47th & 48th states. That number remained unchanged for 47 years. On April 14, 1912 the "unsinkable" ocean liner Titanic, carrying 3,148 passengers and crew sank after colliding with an iceberg. 4 out of 5 perished, many were immigrants. As ships got larger, losses in ocean disasters became staggering. March 4, 1913, Woodrow Wilson became the 28th President, and in 1914 the Panama Canal opened for business. This was a Teddy Roosevelt project that had begun in 1903.



The nation's love affair with the automobile has really "cranked up." The Model T Ford had come on the scene in 1908, but Henry wasn't done yet! In 1913, he introduced the moving assembly line, a car was produced every 93 minutes. The autoworkers jobs became boring and tedious. Ford stifled the discontent by introducing the

unheard of 8-hour work day with wages of \$5 per day. An 8-hour work day meant 3 shifts every 24 hours, reducing the cost of a new Model T to \$260. Most working families could afford a "Tin Lizzie." By the end of the decade more than half of the cars on American roads were Fords. The Model T was discontinued in 1927, having sold 15.5 million cars, when the population of the country was 92 million.

In German Lutheran Wisconsin, English was making inroads. In 1911, Synod produced its first English hymnal of 115 songs and in 1914, introduced an English publication, "The Northwestern Lutheran." Synod was trying, but the people weren't buying. Most English publications barely broke even. Those who had arrived as many as 50 years ago still wanted German. St. Peter's school was steadily growing. Looking to the future, the school dedicated in 1903 was built with 4 classrooms when only 3 were needed. In 1911, the 4th class was added. In 1913, on recommendation of a lay committee, St. Peter's introduced an envelope system and by December 1914, the congregation was debt free.

In 1910, the entire community, but especially St. Peter's church and school, suffered a heart wrenching loss. On Friday afternoon, April 29, three 9-year-old girls, having been warned not to do so, decided to take a shortcut on the very long walk home.



They were walking hand in hand. The headline tells the tale: "Little Girls Drowned in River Near West Scott St." There were 2 parallel trestle bridges crossing the river. The Northwestern bridge was a main line track. The girls didn't know a train was approaching. They were half-way across when the first train whistle blew. Even though the train was able to stop, the girls panicked

and fell into the icy water. Amanda Leu and Hilda Lemke drowned, Mollie Lemke was plucked from the water when she bobbed to the surface. Passengers on a passing Soo Line train witnessed the tragedy. School let out early on Monday, May 2^{nd} , for the huge double funeral. Eight girls from school served as pallbearers for their friend's two small white caskets.

The tragedy doesn't end there. Life was so fragile, medical so primitive, contagious diseases so prevalent. Twelve years later, when Mollie was 21, she died of tuberculosis and is buried in Estabrook Cemetery near her sister and her friend and next to her own 3-week-old infant, who died 8 months earlier. **Check out online @ wordpress.com: From a train bridge, a Fond du Lac tragedy.** https://nebulabit.wordpress.com/
