# On this rock I will build my Church

The Faith of our Fathers

On April 18, 1906 San Francisco was struck by a devastating earthquake that shook the nation. The 7.9 magnitude event wreaked destruction over 80% of the city. Ruptured gas lines caused fires that raged uncontrolled for 3 days, wiping out 5 square miles of the central city. The fires were so intense it was nearly a month before bank vaults cooled enough to be opened. The event killed 3000 people and left 225,000 homeless.

In 1907, Oklahoma became the 46<sup>th</sup> state. On September 16, 1908, General Motors was founded and bought Cadillac, the top selling luxury automobile of the day. In 1909, the first Lincoln penny was minted. It remains the nation's oldest coin and since inception, 55 quadrillion have been struck. March 4, 1909, William Taft was inaugurated as the 27<sup>th</sup> president. His predecessor, Teddy Roosevelt was the first president to ride in an automobile. Taft was the first president to own one.

During the summer of 1907 synod met at St. Peter's for the final time, yet synod's and St. Peter's lives would be intertwined for many years to come. Prior to this convention, Pastor Bergemann was chairman of the Apache Mission Committee, and the year before the congregation permitted him to spend a month in Arizona. Now Bergemann was elected Vice President. President Von Rohr died soon after and Bergemann became president. He held this office for the next 25 years. Check out online at WELS Historical Institute, President Gustav Bergemann.

St. Peter's faithful teacher, Anne Schmedtjen had taken a leave of absence in 1904 for health reasons. Health was not restored, so in 1905 she resigned her position. She was an integral part of the St. Peter's School for 22 years. Photographs of her appear very stern and iron-fisted, but her students loved her. Her 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary was planned and celebrated by them. There was no woman on the faculty for 9 years before she started, nor for 6 years after she left. She was replaced with Philip Saxmann, who himself recently returned from sick leave. By God's grace, he served for 20 years.

1908! St. Peter's Golden Anniversary! With great joy and planning, projects were begun. 1907 was filled with special fund raising for renovations. A Golden

Anniversary book was produced. The book was published by Northwestern Publishing House in Milwaukee, and of course, it was in German! At the time of publication only 3 of the founding fathers remained. Frauenverin (the Women's Club) had membership of 93, the Young People's Association numbered 42, there was a mixed choir, a men's choir and an orchestra. Another organization spoken of very briefly was the Sick-Aid Society, which seems to have been all male. It numbered 99 members. Statistics recorded include 2,756 baptisms, 1,430 confirmations, 586 marriages and 746 funerals.



The balcony was expanded to seating of 200 funded by the Frauenverein. In March, a new roof was put on. As soon as Easter services were finished, church was moved to the school hall and Associated Artists of Milwaukee began working on the interior. The deteriorating ceiling was replaced, the heating system upgraded and Milwaukee Mirror and Art Glass Works installed the treasured stained-glass windows. A service of rededication was held for the members on June 28. The official Jubilee services in German and English were held on Sunday, August 16 with former pastors Mayerhoff and Streissguth preaching.

The joyful jubilation was short-lived, for September 25, that year was "the night the churches burned."

All praise to God who reigns above, the God of all creation, The God of wonders, pow'r and love, the God of our salvation! With healing balm my soul he fills, the God who ev'ry sorrow stills — To God all praise and glory!

The Lord will not forsake his flock, His chosen generation: He is their refuge and their rock, their peace and their salvation. As with a mother's tender hand, He leads his own, his chosen band – To God all praise and glory!

A year-ago at this time we had a deficit of \$118,207.64 versus a deficit of \$198,108.85 as of the end of September. This year had 39 Sundays as of the end of September as did last last year. Our total accumulated deficit at the beginning of the year was 10,364.24 which increased to 208,473.09 as of the end of September. Remember that last year we received the Employee Retention Credit for wages paid during COVID totaling almost \$60,800. This does impact the comparison of the data above. The Contributions are about 0.9% below those of last year.

#### Other Notes:

LWMS: The door collection for LWMS totaled \$544.

HVAC Controls: ½ the cost of the new HVAC controls (new Direct Digital Control System for our Boiler project) was paid this month totaling \$24,966.50. The other half of the controls will be paid in 24 monthly payments of \$1,056 starting in October. This will be funded as planned by the Improvement Fund.
