The Faith of our Fathers

March 4, 1925 Calvin Coolidge, "Silent Cal", a conservative with a dry sense of humor, was inaugurated after winning the election in his own right. Best selling lists now included the names of William Faulkner, Ernest Hemingway and Carl Sandburg.

By the late 20's gasoline powered buses began replacing electric trolleys and streetcars. "Talkies" were overtaking the motion picture industry. Fond du Lac had a theatrical history with several live production theaters. Those are now replaced with motion picture theaters. On Main Street in mid-1925, Fischer's Fond du Lac Theater opened followed by the The Retlaw on December 23rd.



Like DMLC, enrollment at Northwestern College and the seminary were also increasing. A new seminary was planned for Wauwatosa when 80 acres became available in Mequon. The "Wartburg" design easily adapted to the new site, and during the national convention, August 18, 1929, the building was dedicated. A 500-voice mass choir sang, a brass band provided accompaniment for the hymns, and the makeshift sound system worked very well. "Plank and block" seating was provided for 12,000.

15,000 attended. It remains the largest gathering of synod members in history. In 1928 enrollment was 40. In 1929 it was 70.

St. Peter's congregation was discussing an addition to the school since 1921 and fundraising was underway. The Wisconsin Industrial Commission determined the building to be a fire hazard due to overcrowding. The congregation realized that an addition was not practical and decided to build a new school. This would require more room so a lot to the west of the property was purchased. The arrival of Pastor Moussa was timely and a perfect fit. He was young, energetic and a supporter of education, having previously served as Assistant to the Dean at Northwestern College. Upon his arrival he founded the Men's Club and gave his attention to the construction of the new school. Groundbreaking was held on

March 27, 1925, the cornerstone laid on April 26 and dedication was November 8. The school had a faculty of 8. Pastor Moussa urged using the old school by adding a 9th grade and inviting other congregations to encourage students to attend. In the 1925-26 school year it was accomplished. Thus began Winnebago Lutheran Academy.

April 27, 1928 was a very dark day for St. Peter's and WLA. From the 1938 anniversary book: "Having finished its school and parish community building (there were bowling alleys there) the congregation enjoyed several years of peaceful prosperity under the leadership of both pastors and a competent school faculty."

1928: "But it pleased our Heavenly Father to bring to the congregation a painful reminder that we 'are not of this world' and that His children must beat the cross following the Savior. Pastor Moussa had for some year previous to his coming to Fond du Lac been suffering with a stomach ailment which, however, until now had not appeared to be alarming. When early in 1928 he began to suffer with renewed and rather violent attacks of his ailment and on advice of his physicians went to Mayo Clinic at Rochester, Minnesota, and had to submit to a serious operation, word came on April 27th that our beloved pastor had succumbed....Pastor Moussa's death was a sever blow to the congregation." Pastor Moussa was laid to rest at his family's plot in Burlington, Wisconsin.

October 7, 1928, Pastor Gerhard Pieper was installed. Members tackled the issue of the "new school" debt. A voluntary offering was held on Pentecost as members laid their offerings on the altar. \$24,000 was raised that single day reducing the \$61,000 owed to \$37,000.

March 4, 1929 Herbert Hoover became the 31st President and then, on October 24, 1929, "Black Thursday," the stock market crashed ushering in the worldwide Great Depression.

A year-ago at this time we had a deficit of \$156,160.71 versus a deficit of \$253,568.46 as of the end of October. This year had 43 Sundays as of the end of October versus 44 last year. Our total accumulated deficit at the beginning of the year was 10,364.24 which increased to 263,932.70 as of the end of October. Remember that last year we received the Employee Retention Credit for wages paid during COVID totaling almost \$60,800. This does impact the comparison of the data above. The Contributions are about 1.5% below those of last year.

Other Notes:

HVAC Controls: We have begun paying for the second $\frac{1}{2}$ of the cost of the new HVAC controls (new Direct Digital Control System for our Boiler project). This will be paid in 24 monthly payments of \$1,056 the first of which was paid in October. This will be funded as planned by the Improvement Fund.

Honoring the LORD! (HTL): This month the gifts to the HTL envelopes totaled \$9,861.55. This resulted in our paying an additional \$10,000 on the principal of our building loan.
