UPDATE FROM PASTOR BOEHRINGER After consultation with my doctors I have resumed chemotherapy, starting this week. With the information we have now, it appears that two different cancer processes are affecting me. One process is a high-grade aggressive cancer, which responded well to my earlier rounds of chemo. However, wide-spread low-grade cancer remains in my abdomen. So for the foreseeable future the purpose of my treatments is to maintain my health as much as possible. YEAR-END GIVING A tax-efficient way to support the ministry of St. Peter's – If you're age 70.5 and older, you can support St. Peter's by requesting a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) directly to St. Peter's. Even better, if you're age 72 and older, the QCD will count toward your required minimum distribution. Qualified Charitable Distributions (up to \$100,000 per person per year) are excluded from taxable income. Please contact your tax professional to learn how you can make a tax-wise gift to St. Peter's, the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod, or Winnebago Lutheran Academy. It is recommended to make a QCD well in advance of New Year's Eve because the money has to be out of your account and the check needs to be transferred to the charity and deposited by the charity no later than December 31 of the current tax year.



On this rock I will build my Church The Faith of our Fathers

Mid-way through the 1930's, in '35 the Federal Bureau of Investigation was established with J. Edgar Hoover at the helm. He was not related to the former president. On August 14, President Roosevelt signed the Social Security Act. Wisconsin was a major player. Wisconsinites Edwin Witte and Arthur Altmeyer were appointed to lead the commission that wrote the bill; Elisabeth Brandeis of Madison and her father, noted Supreme Court Justice Louis Brandeis, were instrumental in building support; and Senator Robert LaFollette, Jr. got the bill through congress.

The state of Wisconsin had its own "Little" New Deal under the leadership of Governor Phillip LaFollette. Having established the Union Bill of Rights in 1931, in 1935 he made rural electrification his priority. This was not an easy task. The power companies were interested in turning a profit. It was cheap to electrify a city, very costly to wire the countryside. The LaFollette's were brothers, sons of "Fighting" Bob.

In '36 the Hoover Dam was completed. The project was begun in 1931 during the Hoover administration and was named for him. Dedication was September 30, 1935. FDR presided at the dedication and because of political rivalry refused to acknowledge it as "Hoover Dam". In his speech and ever after it became "Boulder Dam."

In '36 the Olympics, under much controversy, were held in Berlin. It was an event in which Nazi Germany intended to prove to the world that they were the "master race". Jesse Owens, a black competitor from the US won 4 gold medals, and Hitler was furious and his ego was severely deflated.

January 20, 1937 President Roosevelt began his second term. This is now the new and official date for inaugurations. That year the Golden Gate Bridge was completed. Construction began in 1933. This landmark hosts 10 million visitors each year, and each year 40 million vehicles cross the San Francisco Bay.

Back home at St. Peter's, as early as 1928, suggestions had been made within the congregation that it might be wise and feasible to establish a sister congregation on the "west side", but there was no money to make it happen. The possibility

resurfaced in 1936 when it appeared that a viable piece of land might be available, but this second opportunity also fizzled. Then, in 1939, the congregation purchased "the Sizer home" at Forest and Hickory. A nucleus of members from St. Peter's began holding services there, and on October 13th a call was extended to Pastor Waldemar Pless and Redeemer Lutheran Church was born.

In 1938 the 80th anniversary of St. Peter's congregation and the 75th anniversary of the school were acknowledged with the first English language publication of our history. The book has separate chapters on the congregation, the school, WLA and music. This is an extremely well written and detailed document and the few remaining copies are rapidly disintegrating. We hope to soon have it preserved through digitization. At the time the Concordia Choir was 66 years old, the Male Choir 35 and the Women's choir 17 years. WLA was 13. The statistics were: 1,750 communicants; 632 voting members; school enrollment of 258, and 118 attending WLA.

October 6, 1939 St. Peter's "Ushers' Club" was begun with 50 men divided into 5 teams. This brought good order to worship services. That same month the Academy Auxiliary was founded. But the date that made the history books was September 1st when Nazi Germany deviously, viciously and without warning invaded Poland and the world was yet again at war. Google "The Invasion of Poland". The National WW II Museum in New Orleans is a good site to visit.
