**YEAR-END GIVING** A tax-efficient way to support the ministry of St. Peter's – If you're age 70.5 and older, you can support St. Peter's by requesting a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) directly to St. Peter's. Even better, if you're age 72 and older, the QCD will count toward your required minimum distribution. Qualified Charitable Distributions (up to \$100,000 per person per year) are excluded from taxable income. Please contact your tax professional to learn how you can make a tax-wise gift to St. Peter's, the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod, or Winnebago Lutheran Academy. It is recommended to make a QCD well in advance of New Year's Eve because the money has to be out of your account and the check needs to be transferred to the charity and deposited by the charity no later than December 31 of the current tax year.

A year-ago at this time we had a deficit of \$156,083.46 versus a deficit of \$267,567.84 as of the end of November. This year had 47 Sundays as of the end of November versus 48 last year. Our total accumulated deficit at the beginning of the year was 10,364.24 which increased to 277,932.08 as of the end of November. Remember that last year we received the Employee Retention Credit for wages paid during COVID totaling almost \$60,800. This does impact the comparison of the data above. The Contributions are about 1.8% below those of last year.

#### Other Notes:

**Thanksgiving:** The Thanksgiving Envelope offerings totaled \$11,509. In 2023 that total was \$14,267.

**Honoring the LORD! (HTL):** This month the gifts to the HTL envelopes totaled \$11,066.57. This resulted in our paying an additional \$11,000 on the principal of our building loan.

The Faith of our Fathers

#### 1945

January 20, 1945 Franklin Roosevelt was inaugurated for his 4th term with Harry S. Truman, senator from Missouri as his VP. The win, however, was not another landslide. It was obvious FDR's strength was waning and the nation was weary of war.

It is hard to convey the magnitude of World War II. It encompassed more territory and more nations than any conflict in history. The Axis powers had gained control of Europe from the top of Norway throughout the Mediterranean and all of north Africa; Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia, Libya and Egypt. Only Great Britain was still standing. Japan had invaded vast territories of Asia and the Pacific Ocean and its islands. The Atlantic became a watery battlefield with losses of 3,500 merchant ships and 175 Allied warships. It WAS "the greatest generation" that saw our nation through this war. But now it's 1945 and beginning to look promising. It's been 6 months since D-Day (the largest amphibious assault in history) when under great secrecy 160,000 allied soldiers stormed the beaches of Normandy. It would be another 5 months until Victory in Europe Day.

In February, the Allied leaders, Churchill, Roosevelt and Stalin, held a critical weeklong conference in Yalta, Crimea. It laid the foundations for the end of the war and the United Nations. Roosevelt's doctors urged him not to go, but it was too important. He went. A trip was being planned to visit London and Paris and the troops, but his blood pressure and failing heart took him to his retreat in Warm Springs GA, instead. It was here, April 12, 1945, at the age of 63 years that he died. The nation and the world were stunned. He was buried 4 days later at his mother's rose garden in Hyde Park, NY. A memorial service was held for the American president at St. Paul's Cathedral in London. At this gathering Churchill closed his remarks with "In Franklin Roosevelt there died the greatest American friend we have ever known and the greatest champion of freedom who has ever brought help and comfort from the new world to the old."

Westminster Cathedral installed a prominent engraved marble memorial as a tribute "To The Honored Memory of Franklin Delano Roosevelt 1882-1945 A Faithful Friend of Freedom and of Britain – Four Times President of the United States"

Harry Truman inherited the task of bringing this terrible conflict to a close. Germany surrendered May 8, 1945 when the Allies took Berlin. It would take the atom bomb to bring Emperor Hirohito to his knees. Finally August 14, 1945, became Victory in Japan day. The end of the war!! The jubilation was universal. Citizens of every city in the Allied world took to the streets in throngs. The celebrations went on for hours. 16 million US citizens served in World War II. Flags with a blue star were hung in windows letting the world know "a soldier lives here". By the end of the war 405,000 had gold stars. "Our soldier is dead". There are 14 US cemeteries on foreign soil where 93,000 are buried. Each cemetery has a "Tablet of the Missing". Those number 79,000. Wisconsin loses were 8,149 dead and over 13,000 wounded. The war remained a focus of the world for several years as the challenging task of recovery began; the horrors of the holocaust were revealed; the judgments at Nuremberg were declared and reconstruction of bombed out cities began.

**Lest We Forget:** World War II has more written documentation than any other relatively short period of history. St. Peter's School library has several shelves of material including the multi-volume set of Time/Life books and the World War II encyclopedia. A war hero from Fond du Lac, James Megellas wrote a book "All the Way to Berlin" which inspired the PBS documentary "Maggie's War". The Diary of Anne Frank was written by a Jewish girl during two years of hiding from the Nazi's in Amsterdam. She was hidden with seven other family members and friends. They were discovered in August 1944, weeks before the Allies crossed the Dutch border. They were deported to Nazi concentration camps. Of the 8, only Anne's father survived. Originally written in Dutch, the book has been translated into 70 languages. Check it out.
