The Faith of our Fathers

1950 - 1954

The repatriation of US and British held POW's was complete by 1948. Not so in Russia. Many were not released until after Stalin's death in 1953. It was free forced labor. Churchill's predication about Russia was on the mark. In June 1950 Stalin equipped North Korea with weapons to invade South Korea. This bloody conflict lasted 3 years claiming the lives of millions of Korean citizens and 100,000 United Nations soldiers. 132,000 Wisconsinites served, 749 gave the ultimate sacrifice. Stalin was succeeded by Krushchev. Things did not improve.

At the mid-point of the 20th century, life in the US was getting comfortable.100 years ago life expectancy was 40 years, now it is 67. Infant mortality has dropped from 50% to 4%. In 1941 in the 11 months before the war began, the US produced 3 million cars. In the next 4 years only139 were built. America's love affair with the auto reawakened. By 1950 most factories had transitioned back to civilian production. That year over 8 million cars came off the assembly line.

Truman opted out of the 1952 presidential campaign. The ticket was General Dwight Eisenhower against Adlai Stevenson. The "I Like Ike" slogan resounded and he won by a landslide carrying 39 of the 48 states becoming the first Republican president in 20 years.

The 1950's brought a population explosion to Wisconsin. 28 million residents were added. Statewide the number of television stations increased from 100 to more than 500. Sadly, the 1950's are considered the forgotten decade of Packer's history.

1952 was an expansion year for synod world missions. Following the exploration by Hoenecke and Wacker the first Lutheran Church in Africa was established outside Lusaka, Zambia and the first missionary was sent to Japan. In 1954 the AZ/CA District was formed,

At St Peter's the decade opened with concern that the church might collapse. The foundation was crumbling due to the drought. The cellar had not been used as a furnace room since the new school heating plant was installed 25 years ago. The decision was made to redo the footings and foundation excavating deep enough to build a usable auditorium. Even though many volunteers worked long hours the cost incurred amounted to \$40,000, that's \$530,000 today! The splendid new basement

with restroom facilities and a small kitchen was dedicated May 6, 1951 with a huge open house.

Pastor Pieper, with preaching assistance, had been serving solo since 1947. Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary was launching a vicar program. Initially this was on a volunteer basis. Now it is part of the curriculum. St. Peter's decided to participate and did so for 5 years. For the 1953 – '54 school year Jerome Spaude was assigned, and '54 – '55 it was Martin Janke.

The original WLA Association was comprised mainly of individuals. In spring 1952 the building fund stood at \$20,000. That fall enrollment reached 152. The old school was filled to capacity. At the November annual meeting thoughts of a new building were revived. May 1953, wanting to engage an architect and get plans drawn, "The Five Year Plan" and a fund drive involving 11 congregations was begun. \$165,000 was subscribed, \$71,000 from St. Peter's. Another postponement was necessary as this was not enough collateral to acquire a loan from any financial institution. Many hoops were jumped through to get a shovel in the ground. To comply with legal and financial requirements the WLA Association had to disband, totally reorganize and change its constitution. This was accomplished by early 1954 and September 26th a cornerstone laying service was conducted with the theme "Christ is our Cornerstone". The timing was perfect. Synod was suffering a severe shortage of women teachers. Late 1954 the request came to use the not yet built new academy for an emergency teacher's course. This consisted of a summer at New Ulm, full year at the academy followed by another summer at New Ulm with synod furnishing the teaching staff. The proposal was approved in early 1955.

Even though he retired in 1947, Pastor Bergemann was still part of the scene at St. Peter's. He died May 13, 1954 at the age of 91. God granted him 60 years of blessed ministry to our congregation and to the church at large.

Christ is our cornerstone; on him alone we build. With His true saints alone the courts of heaven are filled. On His great love our hopes we place of present grace and joys above.
