On this rock I will build my Church

The Faith of our Fathers

The post-war years of 1946 - 1949

Russia had been a hostile member of the Allies during the entire war. Churchill urged continuing the fight pushing Russia back behind its own borders, but the rest of the world wanted immediate peace. Germany was split into 4 occupied zones. US, Britain and France controlled the west and Russia the east. Berlin, located deep in the Russian sector, was also split into 4 sections. Within months Stalin delivered his "Hostile Speech" and Churchill his "Iron Curtain Speech" and the Cold War was upon us. In February 1948 with the aid of Russia, the communist party took control of Czechoslovakia; in May Israel became a nation. In June Stalin ignited the first crisis of the Cold War cutting off road, rail and water access to West Berlin isolating its 2 million citizens. The free world launched an airlift to keep West Berliner's alive. In the next 15 months the USAF and RAF flew 278,228 flights delivering 2.3 million tons of food and fuel to the city thwarting Stalin's plan. April 1949 NATO was ratified by 12 nations resulting in access to West Berlin restored and in October the communist People's Republic of China was established.

In 1946 "It's a Wonderful Life" took home the Oscar for Best Picture and Marilyn Monroe signed a contract with 20th Century Fox. Television, introduced just before the war, was exploding. In 1946 8,000 households had TV's, by the end of '49 it was 6 million. No Olympic games were held in 1940 & 1944. They reconvened in '48 without Germany and Japan. London hosted the summer games and St. Moritz, Switzerland the winter. Automobile production halted for the entire war. Converted to aircraft, Ford's Willow Run factory produced 7,685 B-24 Liberator heavy bombers. In 1948 recognizing this contribution, Ford was offered the German company, Volkswagen, free. The offer was declined. In November Harry Truman very unexpectedly won reelection over rival Thomas Dewey.

Back home in Wisconsin in 1946 Cedarburg engineer, Carl Kiekhaefer, expanded his business bringing Mercury Marine to Fond du Lac. 1948 marked Wisconsin's Centennial Year. Thanksgiving Day, 1949, the Packer's played an intra-squad game to raise enough money to finish the season.

The Synod convention of 1947 voted to begin exploring foreign fields. The '49 convention commissioned Pastors Edgar Hoenecke and Art Wacker to assess the potential in Africa. They spent 3 weeks there driving over 4,000 miles. Check out **welsfriendsofafrica.com**, "WELS 49'ers Plus 70". It's a wonderful account of their experiences.

In 1946 the WLA Association began a building fund and purchased 12 acres of land on Merrill Avenue. Then thoughts of building were tabled for several years.

At St. Peter's, there was great joy that the war was finally over and the congregation was debt free. Pastor Pieper had now been serving the congregation for 18 years with Bergemann as his assistant. They suggested exploring the possibility of establishing a congregation on the south side of town. This was enthusiastically and unanimously approved. Well, that was easy. Why not do more? How about another congregation on the northeast side? This was also approved. While the 1946 Northern Wisconsin District Convention was in session at St. Peter's, Pastor John Raabe was called to serve both locations.

January 19, 1947 the first "south side" service was held at a funeral home with 58 people in attendance. February 11 the congregation was organized and chose the name Good Shepherd. They immediately set about acquiring property and by May 25th held ground breaking services for a new building. February 10th the "northeast" group met at St. Peter's School Auditorium and organized as Faith Lutheran Church. 3 lots were purchased on Johnson Street next to McDermott Park. May 5, 1948 the fledgling congregation dedicated a basement to begin holding services. And the rest is "their" history!

In 1947 Pastor Bergemann retired. The next year the congregation began a 10 year project of replacing school desks. Also in '48 an extreme drought settled over the Midwest causing water tables to drop significantly. By 1949 structural failure was apparent in the foundation walls of the church. Plans were put in motion to address the problem. St. Peter's congregation continued funding the WLA 9th grade through 1949.

Grant then, O God, your will be done, that when the church bells are ringing, Many in saving faith may come where Christ his message is bringing: "I know my own; my own know me, you, not the world, my face shall see.

My peace I leave with you always".
